

GET ACTIVE – INSPIRE YOUR FAMILY AND FRIENDS!

1. Tap water is very inexpensive! You can drink or fill containers without charge from public drinking water sources. We recommend that you take a container with you to fill up instead of bringing bottled water. Also when visiting other towns there are almost always opportunities to fill your container. Alternatively you can often fill up in public buildings and cafés/restaurants with tap water (see project “Refill”).

2. For everyday use change over to tap water! Whether at home, at your place of work or visiting friends. Tap water is to be had everywhere – take advantage of this!

3. Refill Initiative: the concept of Refill is absolutely simple: in shops displaying the Refill sticker on the window or door you can hand over your container and it will be filled for you.

Refill means:

- Protecting the environment
- Avoiding littering
- Tap water is drinking water
- free tap water everywhere you see the Refill sticker



Refill Deutschland is an open project. A business which takes part commits itself to treat everybody in the same manner. The initiative Refill Marburg will be overjoyed when so many shops as possible join up.

If you have a shop in Marburg and want to become a Refill Station then order a sticker from Refill’s website and attach it prominently to the door or window and off you go.

This initiative is a member of the round table of “Blue Community Marburg” and has regular exchanges with other groups working on this theme in Germany – for example “Viva con Agua” and “Refill”.
